
# Daan Roosegaarde floods United Nations Headquarters with Waterlicht New York as a call to action

To mark World Water Day, the Netherlands present Waterlicht New York, a large-scale virtual flood by Dutch artist and innovator Daan Roosegaarde at the United Nations headquarters in New York. Waterlicht which translates to 'water light' is the dream landscape which shows the power and poetry of water. In line with the UN Sustainable Development Goals, the artwork raises awareness around rising water levels caused by global warming.

Sigrid Kaag, the Dutch Minister for Foreign Trade and Development Cooperation, Miroslav Lajcák, the President of the UN General Assembly, Hillary Schrenell, deputy head of the NYC Mayor's Office for International Affairs, Henk Ovink, Dutch Special Envoy Water Affairs and Daan Roosegaarde open Waterlicht New York to show how high the water would reach if we do not take action.

Installed at the North Lawn of the United Nations Headquarters, Waterlicht New York mimics the height of hurricane Sandy with wavy lines of light made with the latest LED technology, software and lenses. As underlined by the New York's mayor office, climate change is "perhaps the toughest challenge New York City will face in the coming decades." The global threat of water is urgent and as Dutch water ambassador Henk Ovink reminds us: "the

Sandys & Harveys of this world will not stop. On the contrary, they are the new normal, becoming more extreme year by year."

The Dutch like the New Yorkers have always adapted to changes in climate and water: exchanging knowledge, forging international partnerships, innovation and an integrated approach. With Waterlicht, Roosegaarde responds with both a warning against rising water levels and an inspiration towards the future: "can we build floating cities, how much power can we generate from the movement of water? Experience the vulnerability and the power of living with water."

WATERLICHT is the dream landscape which explores the power and poetry of water. New site-specific series of Waterlicht were created for Nuit Blanche in Paris, Kings Cross in London, Museumplein in Amsterdam, UNESCO Schokland, the Afsluitdijk, Middelburg and Leeuwarden in the Netherlands.

It is this urgent message that Minister for Foreign Trade and Development Cooperation Sigrid Kaag will aim to drive home at the United Nations Security Council on World Water Day on World Water Day. Identifying the underlying causes of conflict and developing solutions can prevent so much human suffering.
